For	HB 1	Relating to supplemental appropriations and reductions in appropriations and giving direction and adjustment authority regarding appropriations. relating to appropriations for the 2024-2025 biennium.
For	HB 111	Proposing a constitutional amendment providing for the creation of the Texas severance tax revenue and oil and natural gas (Texas STRONG) defense fund, dedicating the money in that fund to benefit areas of the state significantly affected by oil and gas production, and providing for the transfer of certain general revenues to that fund, the economic stabilization fund, the state highway fund, the oil and gas regulation and cleanup account, the Texas emissions reduction plan fund, and the property tax relief fund.
